How will the Light Rail extension impact the Graham Heights Neighborhood? An analysis of case study neighborhoods along the existing Light Rail Line in Charlotte, N.C.

Purpose

- •Graham Heights residents are concerned on how the light rail extension will affect their neighborhood.
- •Concern is around gentrification potentially displacing residents due to increased property taxes .

Data & Methods

- •14 Neighborhoods along the existing light rail were researched •2002-2010 Quality of Life studies were used to document socioeconomic characteristics
- •The time period was selected to show how the neighborhoods changed during the planning of the light rail, to the opening of the rail in 2007, and to years after.

Sustainability


- •Effort at further strengthening the Graham Heights Neighborhood


